## Administration

- Administration met with:
  - We continue to meet with FNBA on the 28<sup>th</sup> to continue efforts on current and future investments.
  - We meet with our attorneys to address the sales & use tax issue. Recommendations is to updated this ordinance vs a temporary suspension. To update we need to list we need to address what we want to tax or not tax in chapter 4.12.
  - We met with Kuna on the 10<sup>th</sup> and they are almost done with the redesign of the Piuraagvik bathrooms. We will be shovel ready by the end of July, if we raise the funds for it. Thanks to the council for requesting EIAP funds of \$481,551. We continue to find grants or opportunity to raise funds for the redesign.

## ❖ NSB Health Equity Grant (\$10,000)

 Initial grant application for purchase of 200 meal packages was declined. Will rescope for purchase of equipment for expanding dry, refrigeration and freezer space.

#### ❖ NPRA GRANTS

 Status of 216 Playgrounds not awarded yet. New project developments. Need to meet and address this separately, as the grant as not formally approved and is still in draft.

## ConocoPhillips Grants

## COU-BUECI Collaborative Projects

- o **COU-BUECI MOU:** Final drafts being negotiated between legal partners.
- COU Resolution Adopting the Utqiagvik Power Grid as Critical Infrastructure: Drafted and submitted for review by COU legal representative.
- Potential COU-BUECI Projects (updated monthly):
  - **Switchgear Replacement:** ICAS and BUECI submitted CIPM project was reviewed by the CIPM PRC March 22nd very positively with no concerns.
  - **CNG station renovation:** BUECI seeks to replace its failing CNG station, used to fuel BUECI vehicles. at ½ of the cost to run. Option for the City to convert its vehicle fleet to this cheaper and more environmentally friendly and local fuel, and to inspire other entities to do the following.
  - Transformer recycling, NPRA funding would be eligible for planning the recycling activities. Subsequently, if the transformers can be listed as an environmental hazard, they could be transported to a recycling facility, if and when they are shown to directly impinge on the interests or plans of the COU.

Nunavak Bay Subdivision Development Master Plan: Combining NPRA road funding with BUECI natural gas pipeline, water and sewer utilities development. A Housing Master Plan is the first step to developing the Nunavak Bay Subdivision (Plat No. 91-18).

 (2021 NOAA Lidar/DEM/Ortho Imagery) for gravel pit is completed. Now working with the Engineering Department in unison with the Cemetery project to develop conceptual exhibits for discussion.
